The good news is that the new government has pledged to outlaw conversion therapies which are aimed at changing people's sexual orientation and/or gender ID.

However, the devil is in the detail and we've been here before under the previous Conservative government and nothing happened. Activists have been pushing for a ban

to include prayer, preaching and pastoral conversations which do not affirm a person's same-sex orientation or gender identity including Trans. We need to keep a watchful eye that there won't be any loopholes that expose groups such as the Trans community to continued. Fingers crossed.
