Nottingham has its first official gay village.

Nottingham has officially now has its own gay village known as the "Rainbow Quarter". On the 17th June, Broad Street, Carlton Street and Heathcote Street in Nottingham's Hockley district became the first official LGBTQ+ friendly area in Nottingham.

The UK government published a draft **Conversion Practices Bill** on 25th June, marking a significant milestone in efforts to protect LGBTQ+ people from abuse. The legislation would make it illegal to attempt to change a person's sexual orientation or gender identity, and applies to England and Wales. The commitment to ban such practices dates back eight years to Theresa May's government in 2018, and has

since been reaffirmed by Boris Johnson and Keir Starmer. The draft bill contains three proposed criminal offences, targeting practices ranging from beatings and psychological manipulation to exorcisms. Legal loopholes have allowed perpetrators to escape justice, leaving LGBTQ+ people vulnerable. The bill is trans-inclusive, meaning it aims to ban attempts to change both a person's gender identity and sexual orientation.
